#### GAME HIGHLIGHTS:

- With his game-high 31 points on 12-24 FG's, Kevin Durant set a franchise record by recording 30+ points in SEVEN consecutive games.
- OKC had an opportunity to win the game in regulation. With 4.5 seconds remaining, the Thunder in-bounded the ball to Durant, but his 30-foot jump-shot came up short, thereby forcing a five-minute overtime session.
- In overtime, Michael Redd shot a perfect 3-of-3 from the floor as he recorded six of his team-high 27 points in the overtime period.
- Thunder guard Russell Westbrook came one rebound shy of his second career triple-double. On the night, Westbrook handed-out 13 assists while failing to commit a single turnover. His 13 assists without a TO are the most by an OKC franchise player since April 8, 2001 when Gary Payton finished with 15 assists and zero turnovers.
- OKC held MIL to 39.6% shooting on the night. The Thunder was previously undefeated this season (4-0) when holding the opposition to sub 40.0% field goal shooting.
- The Thunder allowed a season-high 54 rebounds (19 offensive) as the Bucks outscored OKC 25-18 on second chance opportunities.

#### GAME HIGHLIGHTS:

- Kevin Durant matched a franchise record by recording 30-plus points in his 6<sup>th</sup> consecutive game (Spencer Haywood; January 1972) as the Thunder defeated Utah for their FIFTH consecutive victory. The five-game win streak is the longest by the OKC franchise since March of 2005 (3/18/05 – 3/25/05).
- Trailing 85-86 with 4.5 seconds remaining, Nick Collision knocked-down a pair of free-throws to give OKC a one-point lead. On the ensuing UTA possession, Ronnie Price failed to convert a 21-foot baseline jump-shot as time expired.
- The Thunder entered the game as the best free-throw team in the NBA, but versus the Jazz, OKC shot a season-low 50.0% (14-28) from the charity stripe.
- For the first time in his career, Russell Westbrook handed-out 10+ assists for the third consecutive game. Westbrook becomes the first OKC player to accomplish such a feat since the 2002-03 season when Antonio Daniels recorded 10+ assists in three straight.
- The game featured 11 lead changes and 14 ties.
- For the first time this season, OKC failed to allow a three-point field goal. On the night, UTA shot 0-9 from behind the three-point arc.

#### GAME HIGHLIGHTS:

- With the game tied at 76 apiece through three quarters, OKC outscored WAS 34-22 in the fourth quarter to claim a sweep of their back-to-back match-up versus the Nets and the Wizards. OKC has now won four consecutive contests for the first time since April of 2006 (4/2/06 – 4/9/06).
- Kevin Durant netted a team-high 35 points for his fifth consecutive 30+ scoring effort (matches career-high; February 2009). He is one 30-point scoring game away from tying the franchise record (Spencer Haywood; January 1972).
- Russell Westbrook recorded his seventh double-double of the season with 11 points to go along with a game-high 10 assists. Westbrook has now posted back-to-back double-doubles for the third time in his career.
- Thunder rookie Eric Maynor added seven points on 3-4 shooting in just 12 minutes of action. The Thunder is a perfect 4-0 since acquiring Maynor on 12/22.
- OKC reserves outscored the WAS bench by a 28-8 margin. The Thunder is 9-6 this season when OKC wins the bench scoring battle.

## OKLAHOMA CITY THUNDER NOTES

**KD En Fuego:** With his game-high 31 points vs. the Bucks (12/31), KD set an all-time franchise record by scoring 30+ points in SEVEN consecutive contests. During this two-week long run, Durant posts averages of 33.6 points on 56.8% shooting (84-148 FG's) including 45.8% shooting from behind the 3-point arc (11-24). Earlier this season, KD pieced together nine consecutive games in which he recorded 25 or more points. The nine-game scoring blitz of 25+ points is the longest streak of that kind in the NBA this season.

**Westbrook Dealing:** After recording double-figure assist totals nine times during his rookie season (2008-09), Russell Westbrook just tallied his TENTH double-figure assist game of this season during the Thunder's most recent contest at Milwaukee (1/2). Westbrook, who currently ranks 8<sup>th</sup> in the NBA with 7.3 assists per game, has recorded double-figure assist totals in four straight contests. The last OKC franchise player to record such a feat was Gary Payton who handed-out 10-plus assists in four consecutive games during the 2001-02 season (1/3/02 – 1/10/02). If Westbrook were to record 10+ assists tonight versus the Bulls he would become the first OKC player to record 10-plus assists in five straight games since Gary Payton did so in March of 2000. Oklahoma City is 8-2 this year when Westbrook records 10+ assists.

**High Five:** By defeating the Utah Jazz at the Ford Center last Thursday night, the Thunder captured five straight wins (12/23 – 12-31) for the first time since moving to Oklahoma City. The OKC franchise last won five consecutive contests in March of 2005 (3/18/05 – 3/25/05). At the time, the Thunder's five-game win streak was the longest in the NBA's Western Conference. The OKC franchise also improved to a season-best four games above .500 (18-14) for the first time since the end of the 2004-05 season (52-30). During OKC's five-game undefeated streak, the Thunder shot 48.8% from the floor while outscoring their opposition by a 103.4 to 95.4 margin.

**Talking Turnovers:** During OKC's most recent game vs. Milwaukee (1/2), Thunder guard Russell Westbrook handed-out 13 assists without committing a single turnover. With ZERO turnovers against the Bucks he recorded the most assists (13) without a turnover (in franchise history) since April 8, 2001 (Gary Payton; 15 assists, 0 TO's). Additionally, it is the most assists without a turnover in the NBA in nearly a year (Chris Paul 15 assists, zero turnovers; 1/6/09). Westbrook posts a 4.8 assist-per-turnover ratio in the last ten games. As a team, the Oklahoma City Thunder committed 14 or fewer turnovers in EIGHT consecutive games to close 2009 (12/16 – 12/29). On the year, OKC is 12-7 when committing 15 or fewer turnovers.

**Boards are Key:** With the NBA schedule more than a third underway, rebounding has proven to be a key element of the Thunder's early-season success. OKC who ranks 9<sup>th</sup> in the NBA in rebounding, has outrebounded their opponent in 20 of 33 games this season. In those games, OKC posts a 14-6 record. Meanwhile, the Thunder is just 4-9 when they fail to rebound their opponent. During a three-game stretch last month (12/23 at PHX – 12/28 at NJ), OKC outrebounded their opponent by 10 or more in each of the three straight contests. It has been four years since the OKC franchise last outrebounded their opponent by 10+ in three consecutive games (12/23/05 – 12/29/05). On the season, the Thunder is a perfect 7-0 when outrebounding their opponent by 10 or more.

**Road Warriors:** During the first two months of the season, the Thunder won three consecutive road games on two separate occasions (11/11 - 11/17 and 12/23 - 12/29). As a point of reference, the OKC franchise failed to win three straight road contests in each of the last two seasons. Despite their 97-103 overtime loss to the Bucks in Milwaukee on Saturday night, OKC still owns a 9-8 record away from the Ford Center. OKC has already surpassed their road win total for all of last season (8-33). The Thunder is one of EIGHT NBA teams to boast a winning road record this season.

**Select Company:** If Kevin Durant were to maintain his current 28-plus scoring clip throughout the remainder of the season, he would find himself amongst some select NBA company. Only FOUR players age 21 or younger (as of season's end) have gone onto average 25-plus points. To the right is a list of all players to accomplish the feat.

**Winning with D:** Despite their 103-97 overtime loss to the Bucks on Saturday night, the Thunder still ranks 9<sup>th</sup> in the NBA by allowing 96.5 points per game (allowed 103.1 points per game last season). The Thunder has held their opponent to 90 points or fewer in ten games this season (9-1 record in such contests). Oklahoma City also ranks 6<sup>th</sup> in opponent field goal percentage by allowing their opposition to shoot 44.2%. Lastly, defense is quickly becoming the trademark during Thunder victories this season. In the eighteen Thunder wins (SAC, DET, ORL, LAC, SA, MIA, WAS, UTA, MIL, PHI, GS, MEM, DET, PHX, CHA, NJ, WAS and UTA), OKC is allowing only 92.5 points per game on 43.1% shooting.

**Youth Movement:** The Thunder entered the 2009-10 season as the second youngest team in the NBA with an average age of 25 years and 130 days (as of opening night). They trail only the Memphis Grizzlies who boast an average age of 25 years and 92 days. Additionally, the OKC opening night (10/28) starting lineup (Durant, Green, Krstic, Sefolosa and Westbrook) was the youngest in the league with an average age of 23 years and 179 days. For a matter of comparison, the age of the average NBA roster is 26 years and 329 days and the oldest team in the league entering the 2009-10 season was the San Antonio Spurs with an average age of 29 years and 73 days. There are currently nine players on the Thunder roster age 23 or younger.

**Back-2-Back Sets:** With their victory over the Wizards at the Verizon Center on 12/29, the Thunder captured a sweep of a back-to-back match-up for the first time since March 27<sup>th</sup> and 28<sup>th</sup> of 2007. With seven of the team's 18 back-to-backs now complete, the Thunder has secured a "split" in five of their back-to-back sets to go along with this week's recent "sweep" versus the Nets and Wizards. This year, the Thunder is 4-3 on the first night of a back-to-back and 3-4 on the second night. Last season, the Thunder posted an 8-28 record in their back-to-back match-ups (3-15 in first game, 5-13 in second game).

**New and Improved:** Through the first two-plus months of the NBA season, Thunder second-year guard Russell Westbrook has shown an improved all-around game. During his first 33 contests, Westbrook is averaging 16.0 points, 7.3 assists and 5.0 rebounds in 35.1 minutes per game. Only a select number of NBA players have maintained such averages throughout the course of an entire season. Below is a list of those second-year players to average 16-plus points, 6-plus assists and 4-plus rebounds during their sophomore NBA seasons.

**Race to 4,000...and Beyond:** Kevin Durant, the NBA's 4<sup>th</sup> leading scorer (28.5 ppg) became the second youngest NBA player (behind LeBron James) to reach 4,000 career points scored as he knocked-down a 17-foot jump shot midway through the first quarter during the Thunder's recent contest versus the Boston Celtics (12/4). It took Durant all but 173 games played in his young career to reach the 4,000-point plateau. Based on his current scoring clip, Durant is on pace to reach the 5,000 career points list later this season at Minnesota (2/21).

**Ibaka Surges:** At the end of last month, Thunder rookie Serge Ibaka demonstrated improved play to go along with increased minutes on the floor. Through the first 24 games of his rookie season, Ibaka averaged 3.9 points to go along with 3.7 rebounds in just over 9.0 minutes per game. In the four Thunder contests played between 12/18 – 12/23, Ibaka posted scoring averages of 10.5 points (61.8% FG shooting percentage) in addition to 8.5 rebounds in better than 24.0 of action. During this four-game stretch, Ibaka corralled a career-high 14 rebounds 12/22 at LAL. His 14 boards are the most by an OKC rookie since Jeff Green pulled-down 14 rebounds on 11/23/07 vs. NJ.

**Century Mark:** On December 2<sup>nd</sup> versus the Philadelphia 76ers, Thunder guard Russell Westbrook notched his 100<sup>th</sup> career game in memorable fashion. In 34 minutes played vs. Philly, Westbrook recorded a season-high 15 assists, marking the 14<sup>th</sup> time in his career in which he has reached double-figure assist totals. By posting 11 double-doubles (points and assists) through his first 100 career contests, Westbrook becomes one-of-twelve active players to have accomplished the feat. He joins the likes of Jason Kidd, Chris Paul, Allen Iverson and Deron Williams by posting 11-plus double-doubles comprised of points and assists through his first 100 career games played.

**Technically Speaking:** With six (individual) technical fouls called through the first thirty three games of the 2009-10 season, the Thunder continue their run of being one of the fewest "T'd-Up" teams in the league. During the 2008-09 season, 11 individual technicals (excludes defensive technicals) were whistled on Thunder players and coaches. This total was the fewest awarded to any NBA team during the season. In addition, the Thunder committed 31 total technical fouls (includes individual and defensive 3-second technicals) which tied for the fewest in the NBA (San Antonio). This total also represents the fewest "T's" committed in the NBA since the 1997-98 season (Golden State; 22).

**Defending When it Matters:** During the Thunder's 83-79 victory over the Los Angeles Clippers (11/11) at STAPLES Center, OKC held the Clippers to just 10 4<sup>th</sup> quarter points on 15.8% shooting (3-19 FG's). The 10 points surrendered in the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter is the fewest allowed since the 2006-07 season when the OKC franchise held the New Orleans Hornets to an all-time franchise low six 4<sup>th</sup> quarter points. Through the first 33 games of the season, the Thunder is limiting their opponents to 22.3 points during the final 12 minutes of regulation. In the eighteen Thunder wins, OKC opponents are shooting just 40.5% (136-336 FG's) in the fourth quarter.

**Filling up the Ford:** The Thunder began the 2009-10 season right where they left off... with another sellout. Those that made up the capacity crowd of 18,203 on opening night (10/28) in Oklahoma City were greeted with a new and improved Ford Center. As part of a taxpayer funded initiative passed in March 2008, numerous arena improvements were recently completed. The Ford Center now boasts a state-of-the art scoreboard, new terrace suites and a courtside club to go along with a new and improved Thunder locker room. Last season, fans from near and far flocked to Oklahoma City to witness Thunder basketball. During the Thunder's inaugural season in OKC, the Ford Center recorded 18 sellouts (19,136) including eight consecutive to end the season. In 41 home games, the Thunder's average attendance topped the 18,700 mark (11<sup>th</sup> best in the NBA), accounting for an average capacity of nearly 98.0%. This season, the Thunder has sold-out ten of their first sixteen home contests. The Thunder is drawing an average crowd of 17,942 through the first two months of the 2009-10 season (98.6% capacity).

**KD in Rarified Air:** With his 28-point performance on 11-of-22 shooting versus the Jazz in Utah, Kevin Durant became just the fourth player in league history, joining LeBron James (twice), Shaquille O'Neal and Michael Jordan, to score at least 400 points during the first 15 games of a season at age 21 or younger. Red-hot scoring streaks are not unfamiliar territory to Durant. Last season prior to his injury at Dallas (2/27), Kevin Durant found himself on a scoring tear seldom witnessed by a second year NBA player. In the 17 games prior to his injury (1/16 vs. DET through 2/24 vs. LAL), Durant posted a scoring average of 32.3 points per game. During this five-week long span, Durant led the NBA in scoring by a 2.4 point per game margin (LeBron James; 29.9 ppg). It had been 35 years since a second-year player last averaged 32+ points across a 17-game span (Bob McAdoo; 34.7 ppg during the 1974 season).

**First Impressions:** With their 102-89 victory over the Sacramento Kings on October 28<sup>th</sup>, the OKC franchise secured their first opening night victory since 2003 when they defeated the Los Angeles Clippers 109-100 in Saitama, Japan. During the Thunder's wire-to-wire win at the Ford Center, Russell Westbrook set a career-high with 13 assists to go along with 14 points and seven rebounds. With his 13 assists, Westbrook single-handily matched the entire assist total for the entire Kings team. The last time an OKC franchise player matched the entire opposing team's assist total occurred in 2006 when Luke Ridnour handed-out 13 assists in a 110-106 defeat vs. the Portland Trail Blazers. The Thunder enters tonight's contest versus the Bulls with a record of 18-15 which is the best start for the OKC franchise through the first thirty three games since the 2004-05 season when the team started the season with a record of 25-8.

**Strong back-2-back Showings at the Ford:** With their 127-108 victory over the Wizards on 11/20 and their 108-90 win over the Milwaukee Bucks on 11/27, the OKC franchise won back-to-back home games by 18-plus points for the first time since November of 2004 (Nov. 5<sup>th</sup> – 10<sup>th</sup>). During this two-game home tear, the Thunder averaged 117.5 points on 50.3% shooting (48.6% 3-point shooting). The 127 points scored versus the Wizards on 11/20 was the most recorded in regulation (excluding overtime) by the OKC franchise since February 21<sup>st</sup>, 2001 (127-98 win vs. DEN).

**Perfection from the Stripe:** During OKC's loss to the Sacramento Kings (11/10), Kevin Durant recorded a game-high 37 points in large part due to his efficiency from the charity stripe. Durant set a franchise record by converting 18 made free throws without a miss (also a NBA season-high). Setting all-time franchise records from the free throw line is not unfamiliar to Durant. Last season versus the Los Angeles Clippers (1/23/09), KD converted 24 made free throws (on 26 attempts) en route to a 46-point performance at STAPLES Center. Durant's 24 made free throws set a Thunder franchise record. In addition, Durant set a NBA season-high for most FT's made during the 2008-09 season. In doing so, Durant became one of only four players over the last 20 years to convert 24+ FT's in a single game (MR; LeBron James: 24-of-28 on 3/12/06).

**Let the Balloting Begin:** Thunder forward Kevin Durant, forward Jeff Green and guard Russell Westbrook all appeared on the 2010 NBA All-Star Ballot which was unveiled in November during a special tip-off event in Dallas, the Official Host City of NBA All-Star Weekend 2010. Voting will take place at all Thunder home contests at the Ford Center for games played between Sunday, November 15 vs. the LA Clippers and all the way through Oklahoma City's match-up with Indiana on January 9<sup>th</sup>. The Thunder trio can also be voted-in via online balloting at [thunder.nba.com](http://thunder.nba.com) which begins immediately and continues on through January 18. The 2010 NBA All-Star Game will be played at Cowboys Stadium in Arlington, Texas, before an expected crowd of more than 80,000 – the largest group ever to witness a live basketball game, on Sunday, Feb. 14, 2010.

**Lots of Magic at the Ford Center:** During the Thunder's 102-74 victory over the Orlando Magic on November 8<sup>th</sup>, OKC held ORL to 30 second half points on 29.4% field goal shooting (10-34 FG's). The 28-point margin of victory represents the largest Thunder win in Ford Center history. In knocking-off last season's Eastern Conference Champions, the Thunder shot a season-high 57.1% while handing-out a season-best 27 assists. Meanwhile, Orlando shot a season-worst 36.8% while converting a season-low 25 made field goals. Orlando was held to fewer than 75 points for just the third time in the last three-plus seasons. With the victory, the Thunder notched their third win of the year. It was not until December 19<sup>th</sup> of last season (vs. TOR) before the Thunder would claim their third win.

**Harden Greatest Hits:** In the Thunder match-ups vs. Orlando (11/18) and Washington (11/20), Harden connected on 10-of-13 3-point field goals including seven consecutive makes during this two-game stretch. The seven consecutive makes ties a rookie record for the most consecutive 3-pointers converted by a first-year player since Michael Dickerson made eight straight for the Houston Rockets (5/4/99-5/5/99). His six 3-point makes at Orlando (11/18) tied a rookie franchise record (Rich Frahm; 12/20/03).

**What Lazy Days of Summer?:** The Thunder was the only NBA team to participate in multiple summer leagues this past off-season. Seven players currently on the Thunder roster saw action in the Orlando Pro Summer League (July 5-10) and the NBA Summer League in Las Vegas (July 10-19). Thunder second-year guard Russell Westbrook and OKC Rookie James Harden were both named to the 2009 Orlando Pro All-Summer League First-Team. In addition, Thunder forward D.J. White received second-team honors for his performance in Orlando. In four Orlando Summer League contests Westbrook posted averages of 22.3 points (.519 FG%), 3.5 rebounds and 7.8 assists in 32.3 minutes per game. Harden, the No. 3 overall selection in this past summer's NBA draft participated in a total of nine summer league contests and recorded averages of 14.7 points (.506 FG%), 3.3 rebounds and 2.4 assists in 27.9 minutes per game.

**Country First:** The OKC trio of Kevin Durant, Jeff Green and Russell Westbrook were all invited to participate in the 2009 USA Basketball Men's National Team mini-camp held in Las Vegas this past July. In preparation for the 2010 World Championships and the 2012 Olympic Games in London, USA basketball hosted the three-day event which included an intra-squad Blue vs. White scrimmage on the final day. Thunder Head Athletic Trainer, Joe Sharpe was also invited to participate in the Team USA event.

**Summer Oversees:** Both Nenad Krstic (Serbia) and Thabo Sefolosha (Switzerland) spent the summer months representing their counties as they competed in the 2009 EuroBasket Championships held in Poland. While Sefolosha and Switzerland participated in the Division B bracket, Krstic helped lead the Serbia team to the Championship Game vs. Spain in the upper Division A bracket. In nine EuroBasket contests, Krstic posted averages of 13.4 points, 4.8 rebounds and 1.6 assists in 23.4 minutes per game. Meanwhile, Sefolosha played in four games for the Swiss team and compiled averages of 15.8 points, 6.5 rebounds and 3.3 assists in 37.3 minutes per contest.
